The service in Leeds is based around 3 main hospital sites: Seacroft, St James and Leeds General Infirmary. Seacroft is our main hub where we work alongside the prosthetics service and run up to 4 orthotic outpatient clinics per day. We are fortunate to have excellent, well-appointed clinical facilities at all our sites and good access to workshop facilities and onsite orthotics stock. We have developed strong MDT relationships and are well regarded within; Diabetes, Rehabilitation medicine, Orthopaedics, Rheumatology, Neurology and Paediatrics and have dedicated clinics running within each of the specialities. This offers excellent opportunities to seek specialism within a particular field of particular interest to you.
