Prosthetists and Orthotists'roles are VARIED and VERY REWARDING.

A prosthetist designs and fits artificial replacements – or prostheses – for upper and lower limbs, for people who have lost or were born without a limb.

Somewhere today a prosthetist has:

- Enabled someone to stand on two legs for the first time in months
- Provided a running blade so a child can now join in with their friends in the playground
- Enabled someone to walk without pain
- Helped someone participate in sport with confidence
- Enabled someone to walk upstairs and sleep in their own bed
- Provided an arm which has improved a patient's confidence and body image
- Enabled someone to cook
- Enabled someone to live independently
- Supported somebody to return to work

An orthotist will use a range of orthoses, including splints, braces and footwear, to enhance mobility, prevent falls, reduce pain and facilitate healing.

Somewhere today an orthotist has:

- Prevented limb amputation as a complication of a diabetic foot wound
- Enabled someone to stand for the first time in a long time
- Helped someone to manage physical fatigue and enjoy lunch with their family
- Enabled a child to play with their friends in the playground
- · Helped someone recover from an injury to play sport again with confidence
- Enabled someone to walk following a stroke
- Provided protective headwear so a child can attend nursery
- Enabled someone to live independently without being frightened of falling
- Enabled someone to walk to the shop
