## AHP debate at the Senedd!

In only the second time since the dawn of devolution in 1999, AHPs had a dedicated debate in the Senedd. With the support of AHPF Cymru, Plaid Cymru's health and social care spokesperson, Mabon ap Gwynfor MS tabled a Motion, which was backed by the Welsh Conservative health and social care spokesperson James Evans MS and the leader of the Welsh Liberal Democrats, Jane Dodds MS. The Motion noted the crucial role AHPs played in maintaining a healthy population, by allowing people to be socially and economically active. It also called on the Welsh Government to develop a long-term workforce strategy for AHPs, increase student placements for AHPs; and increase routes to qualifications in Wales to meet growing demand.

During the hour-long debate contributions were had by Mark Isherwood MS, Heledd Fychan MS, Gareth Davies MS, Jenny Rathbone MS and John Griffiths MS. The Cabinet Secretary for Health and Social Services also responded to the debate and paid tribute to the work of AHPs in Wales. A full transcript of the debate can be found [here](#).

## AHPF Cymru manifesto meetings

As we mentioned in the last newsletter, AHPF Cymru launched a manifesto ahead of the Senedd election next year and we are actively engaging with the political parties. Meetings have been held with the politicians writing the manifestos such as Alun Davies MS for Labour, Sam Rowlands MS for the Conservatives and Mabon ap Gwynfor MS for Plaid Cymru.

To remind you, the five key areas of the manifesto are:

- 1.A National Workforce Strategy for AHPs.
- 2.Timely access to AHP services for those working in health and social care.
- 3.Expand access to the AHP professions through exploring routes, in consultation with the professions, such as degree apprenticeships.
- 4.Ensure that services within the community are delivered within suitable buildings.
- 5.Allow patients the right to access AHP services as part of their treatment pathway.

## Apprenticeship discussion

AHPF Cymru has been working hard to make the case for AHP degree apprenticeships. Members have met with leads at Medr and Health Improvement Wales and also with the Head of Apprenticeships at Welsh Government to better understand the context, challenges and opportunities. We will now be working on an influencing document on this topic.

In our last newsletter we bid farewell to David Davies, who left his role as policy officer for the Royal College of Occupational Therapists but this time we are delighted to welcome his successor, Paul Smith. Previously Paul was the Chief of Staff to the Welsh Conservatives in the Senedd and was the author of three manifestos for the 2021 Senedd election and the 2019 and 2024 UK General Elections.
