This role requires a dynamic and adaptable clinician who can work independently and collaboratively. The post holder will be responsible for delivering high-quality orthotic care across a range of clinical settings.

- Prescribe, design, and provide orthoses promptly, including complex technical prescriptions.
- Ensure all interventions are evidence-based and meet professional standards.
- Collaborate with multidisciplinary teams for integrated patient care.
- Maintain accurate clinical records and support audits and service development.
